Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

Mandatory conditions where licence authorises supply of alcohol

1. Where a premises licence authorises the supply of alcohol, the licence must include the following conditions.
2. The first condition is that no supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-
 - a. at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - b. at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
3. The second condition is that every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Recorded background music is unrestricted.

Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours. In this condition, permitted hours means:

- a. On weekdays, other than Christmas Day, Good Friday or New Year's Eve, 10:00 to 23:00 hours.
- b. On Sundays, other than Christmas Day or New Year's Eve, 12:00 to 22:30 hours.
- c. On Good Friday, 12:00 to 22:30 hours.
- d. On Christmas Day, 12:00 to 15:00 and 19:00 to 22:30 hours.
- e. On New Year's Eve, except on a Sunday, 10:00 to 23:00 hours.
- f. On New Year's Eve on a Sunday, 12:00 to 22:30 hours.
- g. On New Year's Eve from the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on the following day (or, if there are no permitted hours on the following day, midnight on 31st December).

The above restrictions do not prohibit:

- a. During the first twenty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises;
- b. During the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
- c. During the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there if the alcohol was supplied for consumption as ancillary to the meals;
- d. Consumption of the alcohol on the premises or the taking of sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;
- e. The ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
- f. The sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
- g. The sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;
- h. The taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
- i. The supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a

- person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied; or
- j. The supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

Music and singing (amplified and unamplified) 12:00 to 00:00 on any Sunday prior to a bank/public holiday (including Easter). Boxing Day and Christmas Eve.

Recorded music

Indoors only

Pre-recorded amplified music including backing for performers and DJ
12:00 to 00:00 on any Sunday prior to a bank/public holiday (including Easter)

Provision of facilities for making music

Indoors only

Provision of piano amplification equipment and karaoke.

12:00 to 00:00 on any Sunday prior to a bank/public holiday (including Easter). Christmas Eve and Boxing Day.

Provision of facilities for dancing

Indoors only

12:00 to 00:00 on any Sunday prior to a bank/public holiday (including Easter). Christmas Eve and Boxing Day.

The prevention of crime and disorder

No irresponsible sales promotions of alcoholic beverages shall be offered to customers. No customers carrying open or sealed bottles shall be admitted to the premises at any time that the premises are open to the public. A sign will be displayed on the premises indicating the standard hours during which the sale of alcohol is permitted.

Public Safety

All fire doors will be maintained effectively self closing and shall not be held open other than by approved devices. notices detailing the actions to be taken in the event of fire or other emergencies, including how the fire brigade shall be summoned, are to be prominently

displayed.

The prevention of public nuisance

No regulated entertainment of any type shall take place outside the premises in any areas which are within the licence holder's control after 22:00 save for any special event seven days' notice of which has been given to the licensing authority and police. When amplified musical entertainment is taking place inside the premises after 22:00 windows and doors, save for entrance and exit purposes, will be kept shut. A sign will be located at the exit(s) requesting that customers leaving the premises do so quietly and with consideration to neighbours.

The protection of children from harm

No one under the age of 16 will be allowed to enter or remain on the premises after 22:00 save on Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve. Anyone who appears to be under the age of 18 and who is attempting to buy alcohol must be required to produce proof of age before such a sale is made.

Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

The conservatory will not be used for live music and regulated entertainment after 20:00 hours.

The outside area will not be used for regulated entertainment.

Sale of alcohol will be granted 09:00 to 23:59 as applied for with 20 minutes drinking up time.

In respect of regulated entertainment the sub-committee have taken into account the representations from local residents in the vicinity and have imposed a condition that activities will cease Sunday to Thursday at 22:30 and on Friday and Saturday regulated entertainment will cease at 23:00.

The premises will be a member of PubWatch and will participate fully including the "banned from one, banned from all" scheme.

Noise from amplified and non-amplified music, singing and speech arising from regulated entertainment at the premises (between the hours of 23:00 and finish of regulated entertainment) shall not be audible inside habitable rooms of noise sensitive properties in the vicinity.

A notice is to be displayed outside asking guests to minimise disturbance to local residents.
